The Honourable Judith Guichon, OBC LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF BRITISH COLUMBIA

The Honourable Judith Guichon was sworn-in as the 29th Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia on November 2, 2012. Prior to this appointment she owned and operated Gerard Guichon Ranch Limited in the Nicola Valley in the British Columbia Interior. The Guichon family has ranched in the area since 1878 and Her Honour's father-in-law was awarded the Order of Canada in 1974 for his leadership in Cattleman's Associations and his contribution to agriculture in Canada. Her four children now manage the ranch with a 700 head cow calf and 700 yearling operation.

Her Honour studied Holistic Management, a farming method which promotes sustainable management of livestock by emphasizing their natural habitat. Along with her late husband, commercial pilot Lawrence Guichon, she introduced Holistic Management to the ranchers of British Columbia.

Her Honour was also involved in several organizations. She served on the local hospital board and Community Health Council and was on the Community Health Foundation board. Prior to this, she served as a 4-H Leader and started a recycling society in Merritt, B.C. with a neighbour. She also served as a director for the Fraser Basin Council of B.C., director of the Grasslands Conservation Council of B.C., member of the Nicola Water Use Management planning committee and played the flute in the Nicola Valley Community Band.

Prior to her term as Lieutenant Governor, Her Honour served on the Provincial Task Force on Species at Risk and completed a two-year term as the president of the British Columbia Cattlemen's Association. She has also been a part of the Ranching Task Force for B.C. and the British Columbia Agri-Food Trade Advisory Council.

Born in Montreal, Quebec, and raised on a farm near Hawkesbury, Ontario, Her Honour moved to British Columbia in 1972. She and her husband, Bruno Mailloux, maintain a residence in the Nicola Valley.


UPCOMING INSTITUTE

NEWS FROM ELECTIONS BC & STUDENT VOTE

Keith Archer, British Columbia's Chief Electoral Officer, would like to remind alumni of the B.C. Teachers' Institute on Parliamentary Democracy that general voting for the May 2013 Provincial General Election is scheduled for Tuesday, May 14, 2013.

The campaign period will officially begin with the issuing of writs of election on Tuesday, April 16, 2013 and marks the beginning of Elections BC's event-awareness campaign through a variety of media. There will be heightened media activity by political parties, constituency associations, candidates, election advertising sponsors and third party advertisers.

Elections BC views the campaign period as an important opportunity to:

EDUCATE future voters about the provincial electoral process, perhaps by conducting a mock election, or conducting a candidates forum, or by asking your District Electoral Officer to speak to a class/school

EXPERIENCE the provincial voting process first-hand by touring a class through a voting place during advance (May 8-11) or general voting (May 14), or by participating in Student Vote's experiential parallel election program (www.studentvote.ca)


ENGAGE youth close to voting age (18) by encouraging employment at a district electoral office, or at a voting place, or to volunteer for a political party or candidate


STUDENT VOTE Election Fever Hits Schools this Spring

This May, British Columbia's elementary and high school students will be casting ballots for the official candidates running in the provincial election.

Student Vote is a parallel election for youth under the voting age, coinciding with official election periods. Students learn about the democratic process and party platforms through in-class activities, campaign events, family dialogue and media consumption. The program culminates with an authentic voting experience where students take on the roles of election officials and conduct a vote on the official local candidates. The results are collected from schools and shared with media for broadcast and publication on Election Night.

An independent evaluation commissioned by Elections Canada reports that the Student Vote Program is having a significant impact among students in the key areas associated with future voting (increased knowledge about politics and the electoral process, higher levels of political interest, enhanced sense of civic duty and increased political dialogue with family). In addition, the evaluation found that the program positively impacts educators' knowledge and confidence in teaching civics, as well as parental voter turnout.
