

- A 4,000 entry directory of Canadian research and government organizations

- Open [Canada Commons](#) or access it through this link on the Legislative Library website: [E-Resources for MLAs and Assembly Staff](#) (click 'eBooks' then 'Canada Commons').
- If prompted, enter your Legislative Assembly network username and password.
- Use the Search box at the top of the page to look for books and documents.
- Click on the Advanced Search feature to help narrow down your search.
- You can also use the top menu bar to browse the collection by topic or lists.
- For titles by organization, click on Publishers in the top menu bar or organization below the search box.
