Our Parliamentary Education Office offers suggestions and a wide variety of resources for students to learn about and become actively engaged with democracy and parliament.

For a General Introduction:

- Learn about the legislative process on Discover Your Legislature at bcleg.ca/DYL
- Invite your local Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA) to your class or school. You can look up your school's MLA on the Member Finder at bcleg.ca/findmembers
- Book an appointment to visit local your MLA's constituency office (or City Hall or MP's office)



How To Engage With Specific Issues:

- Submit a Petition to the Legislative Assembly by following directions at bcleg.ca/petition
- Write a letter expressing your concern about an issue you care about to the Minister responsible or your local MLA



- Present in-person or make a written submission to a parliamentary committee that is relevant to your issue. Learn more at bcleg.ca/committees
- Join a rally on an issue you care about
- Meet with your MLA or an MLA who's passionate about your issue to learn what they are doing to support the concern

How To Get Involved in Politics:

- Register to vote with the list of Future Voters at Elections BC. Learn more at elections.bc.ca
- If 18 years old, vote in all elections (federal, provincial, local)
- Volunteer at your local MLA's or MP's constituency office
- Volunteer for a candidate during an electoral campaign period
- Work for Elections BC during a provincial general election with the Youth at the Booth program. Learn more at elections.bc.ca
- At the post-secondary level, you can join a political club or political party on campus
- Join your school's Student Council to plan and advocate for students
- Join a Model Parliament or Model United Nations

How To Get Involved in Your Community:

- You can volunteer at school, in community centres, seniors' centres, cultural organizations, neighbourhood houses, festival societies, etc.
- Learn about the issues in your community and work towards improving them
- Invite a community group to come speak at your school or form your own school club
