Activities and resources

Book a **guided tour** of the Parliament Buildings. School groups from outside of Victoria can apply for a **School Travel Grant**.

Book a **Virtual Classroom** session. These online sessions provide an introduction to the Legislative Assembly and allow for discussion on topics such as how a bill becomes a law or the levels of government in Canada.

Take a virtual tour of the Parliament Buildings.

Find out about your **school's MLA**, including biographical information, recent speeches and votes, and contact information for their constituency office.

Complete the Library Statues, Calendar Conundrum, or Drafting Legislation activities.

Find lesson plans, videos, fact sheets and other learning resources.

Engagement opportunities

Invite your **school's MLA** to visit the classroom or book an appointment to visit their constituency office.

Have your students write a letter or email to your school's MLA or to a Cabinet Minister.

Submit a **petition** to the Legislative Assembly on an issue of importance to your students.

Present in-person or make a written submission to a **Parliamentary Committee**.

Learn about Elections BC's **List of Future Voters** (16 - 17 year olds) or work as an **election official** during a provincial general election (15 - 19 year olds).
