Outside - Front Lawns

1. There are four figures on the Knowledge Totem. In addition to the fisher and the bone player, what two animals are represented? The **LOON** and the **FROG**.
2. Which object on the front lawn is about as tall as the length of a blue whale?
The **FLAG POLE**.
3. What is British Columbia's provincial tree?
The Western **RED CEDAR**.
4. The front lawns of the Parliament Buildings are where British Columbians can gather to celebrate special events, to promote issues that are important to them, and to peacefully **DEMONSTRATE / PROTEST**.

Inside - First Floor

5. Shxwtitostel (pronounced: Schwe-tea-tos-tel) is the name of the canoe that the Honourable Stephen Point carved during his time as Lieutenant **GOVERNOR** of British Columbia.

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6. The Women and the Vote exhibit covers the history of voting rights in British Columbia. How old do you need to be to vote in a provincial election today?

7. In 1947, a group of 200 children stormed through the Ceremonial Entrance of the Parliament Buildings while protesting the price of **CHOCOLATE**.
8. What Parliamentary symbol is carried into the Legislative Assembly at the start of each day?
The **MACE**.
9. Where can visitors come to watch when the Legislative Assembly is meeting?
The Public **GALLERY**.
10. Each Member of the Legislative Assembly has a place in their community where they can meet with people and help them with issues related to government. What is this called?
A Constituency **OFFICE**.
