- interact with MLAs and Legislative Assembly staff; and,
- become familiar with the resources available through the Parliamentary Education Office at the Legislative Assembly.

Fall 2013 will mark the 15th session of the BC Teachers' Institute.

Since the BC Teachers' Institute was launched in April of 2004, 213 teachers have successfully completed this four-day professional development program.

Today, BCTI Alumni are spreading their knowledge about British Columbia's parliamentary system in every region of BC.

Return to the BC Teachers' Institute as a Facilitator

Teachers who have attended a BC Teachers' Institute on Parliamentary Democracy are eligible to apply to return once as a facilitator.

Facilitators are the first point of contact and provide ongoing guidance and support to participants. Facilitators are expected to be approachable, knowledgeable, and to have excellent organizational and leadership skills. In addition, facilitators will have the ability to promote discussion and critical inquiry into key issues on Parliamentary Democracy.

Successful applicants will have their accommodation, meals, travel, and ToC costs paid for by the B.C. Teachers' Institute. The registration fee is waived for facilitators. Applications to become a facilitator at an upcoming Institute are being accepted online now!
